Livelihoods

Most annual activities have been accomplished with only a few remaining. Under Civil Society, Mr. Juma Chelimo, Livelihoods Asst. held a workshop on **Marketing of Local Products** on Oct.03.

Mr. Okori Emmanuel and Mr. Chelimo also held a workshop for **Community Managed Savings Groups** Oct.19 They have now contributed over 269,000 SSP collected by the community. Two out of Three loans have been repaid.

A **Climate Change Training** for HTPVK staff was held on 08.Oct. We have been following up on the previous trainings especially the beekeepers. Lereboi had a beekeeping practical training and made several bee hives. We are advising farmers to keep the

fields tended and fenced as we don't know if the rains will come in December. So far, there has only been one harvest of sorghum but third harvest looks good.

Livelihoods held another CMSG meeting in Kuron on Monday.Nov.07.2022

Comment: HTPVK is helping us a great deal to save money. You know if we keep this money in our village it will be stolen. HTPVK serves as a safe place for our investments.

Vocational Training

A total of 13 students received certificates for completion of course work on Oct.03: 6 in Auto Mechanics, 7 in Driving, 1 in Welding and 1 in Carpentry. The third structure of two classrooms funded by the People's Republic of China Embassy in Juba has been roofed, plastered, and painted and is ready for classes to use. Toposa Woman speaks about Trauma Healing workshop: We didn't even know this was an issue. Now we realize our aggressiveness has been caused by previous violent events. Now we can deal with these violent events better with your (HTPVK) help.

Comment by health staff: It is very difficult to identify RAPE as no one will report this to the health facility staff. The Toposa are taught this is something normal. If the authorities will implement the law, it will be easier to identify the victims and people will have their rights.



Peace Building

A Conflict Early Warning workshop sponsored by Pax International was held in Namurupus from 03.Nov.to 05.Nov. Elders, Youth and HTPVK Peace department attended. This was to pre-empt conflicts pertaining to movements of cattle during the up-coming dry season. Everyone agreed to try to keep cows and families near Kuron and dig in dry rivers to find water until Feb.2023. Then when next seasons rains arrive they can go to the hills around for grass.

The Peace Department organized a 3-day Women's **Forum** to give the Toposa women a voice and platform to express their opinions and comments. Community clean up events were organized for the Peace Academy. Many members of the Women's communities in the area came to help slash, clean and fix up the buildings at the Peace Academy. This was to instill a bit of "ownership" amongst the people. (right)

Positive Outcome: A birthing mother was emergency transported to Kapoeta as the child was breached and their lives were in jeopardy. Through quick action of the HTPVK logistics and Health Team, both mother and child are safe and sound today after successful surgery and delivery.

Comment by Minister of Health Hon. Lodae: Our people have seen the level of need for this population. We are ready to help.

Comment: We learned how to manage the convulsions during pregnancy. We also learned that in cases of suspected rape we need to counsel and examine with caution and care and in private to protect the dignity of the woman.

Primary Health Care Centre

Clinical Officer, Richard Leonard and Midwife, Patricia Nakalong attended a 3 day workshop on Clinical Management of Rape and a 5-day Basic Emergency Management of Pregnancy workshop both sponsored by CCM in Kapoeta.

Hon. Titus Lokwachuma donated 9 new mattresses to the Health Centre In-Patient Ward. A buffer stock of medicines was given to carry over until the MOH regular supply arrives. The entire health center was cleaned this month. (right)

There are many cases of asthma in the PHCC. We have discovered some students have epilepsy. There is no medicine to treat either disease.

A fifteen member delegation from the Ministry of Health arrived on 11. November for a **Supportive Supervision Visit**. Minister of Health for E. Equatoria State Hon. Lodae Pascalino Romeo Woyakori, Director General Hon. Itien, County Health Director, Hon. Joseph Lotira, Health Pooled Fund Project Coordinator, Dr. Amin Gordiano Okwahi Tafeng along with Amref/CCM representatives spent the day at the Primary Health Center talking with staff and patients.

Health Positive Outcomes: In 2022, there have been 9 cases of TB reported to the PHCC. One of these has completed the treatment course and 8 others are still in the process.

As of October there are 6 Teachers and 85 students in Secondary School. There are 23 female students. Senior 1 has 26 students in 2022.








Roads & Infrastructure

We continued to buy stones and sand for construction of buildings and road maintenance.


